Overview of Our Study

- StarScout - Detecting suspicious fake star activities at scale



- Measurement Study - Quantifying prevalence, domain, and impact

Measurement Study - Quantifying Prevalence, Domain, and Impact

Dataset

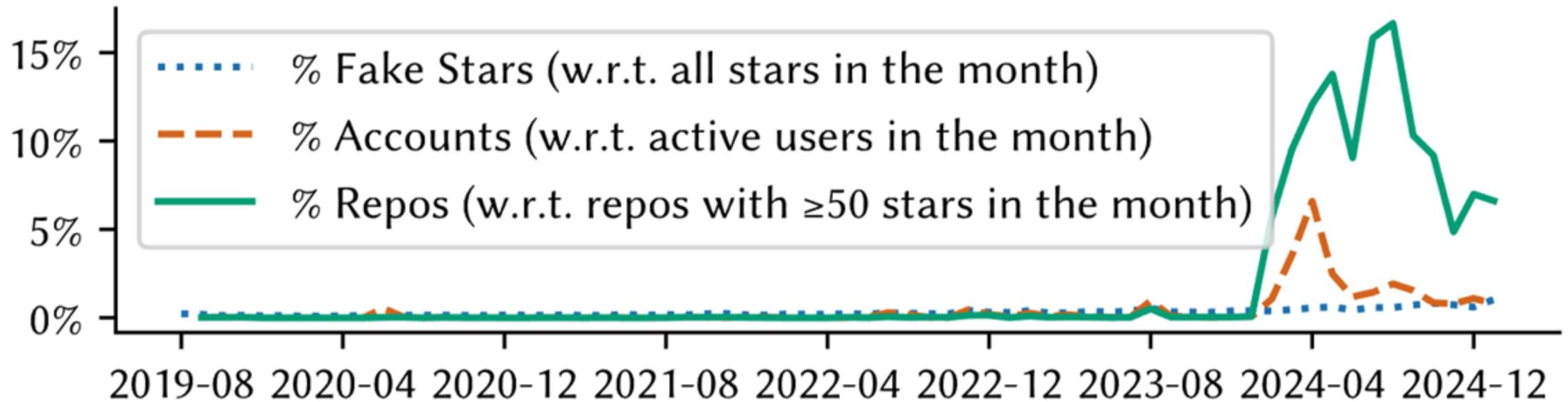
~6 million fake stars

18k repositories

301k accounts



- **Finding 1:** Fake star activities **surged in 2024**



- **Finding 2:** Most repositories with fake star campaigns are **short-lived**, but accounts can **stay active for a long time**.

Repository Lifespan

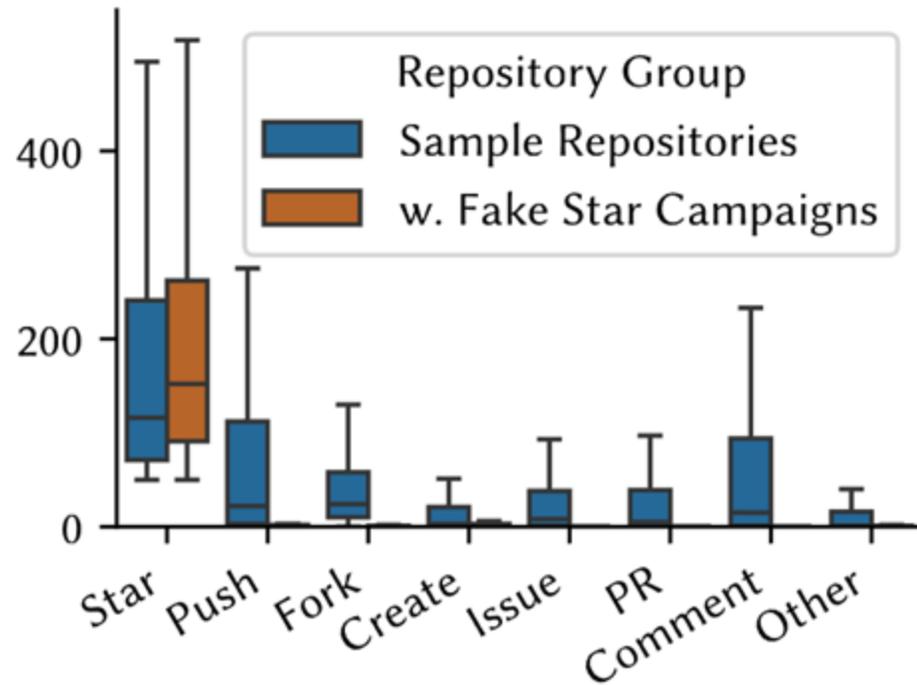
Median = 1 day

Account Lifespan

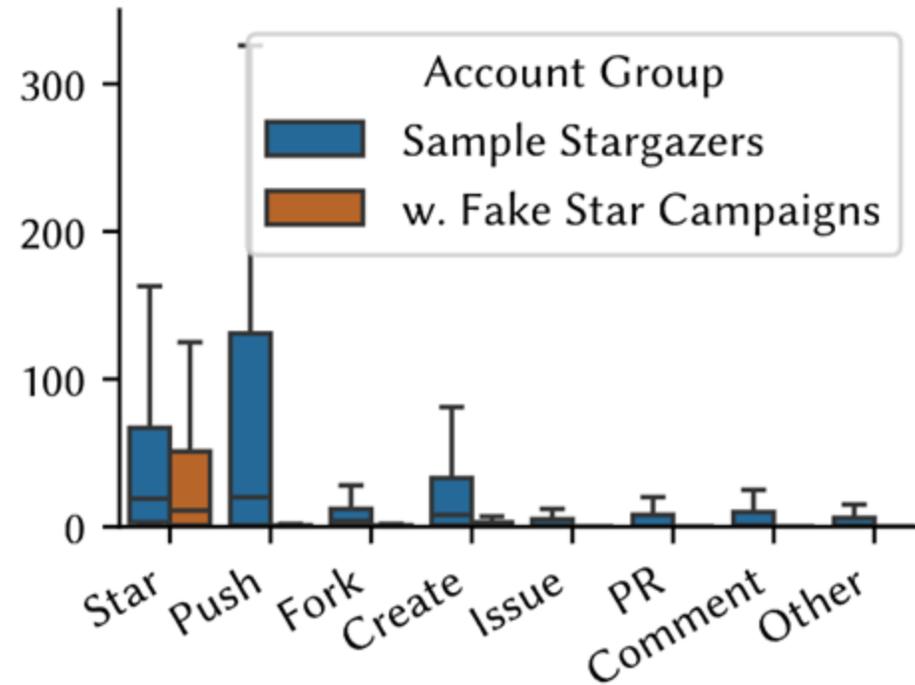
Median > 100 days

(Similar to regular accounts)

- **Finding 3:** Most fake star repositories and accounts **do not have meaningful activities** (e.g., issues, PRs, commits) beyond starring

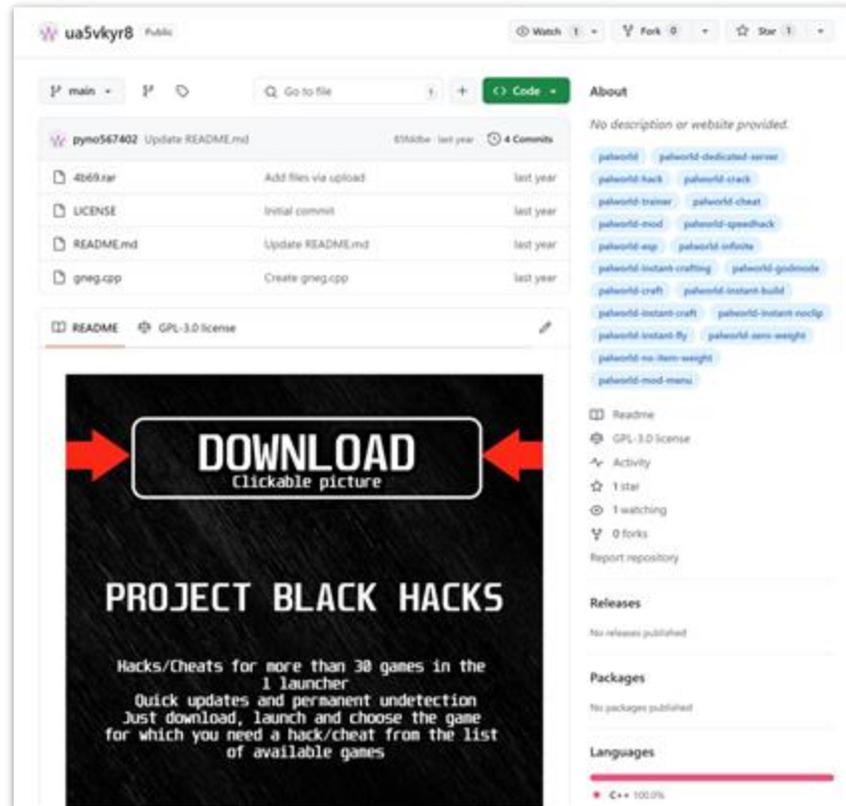


a) Repositories

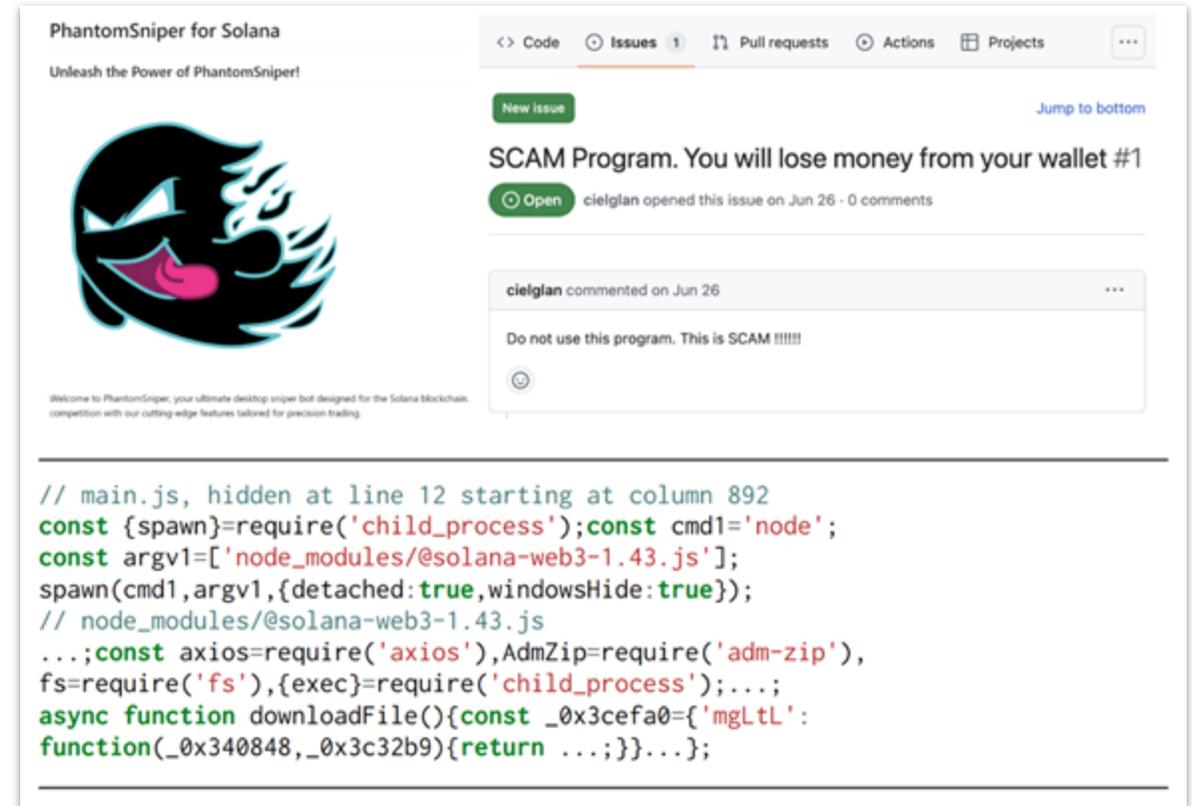


b) Accounts

- **Finding 4:** Most (~90%) of the fake star repositories are **phishing malware**

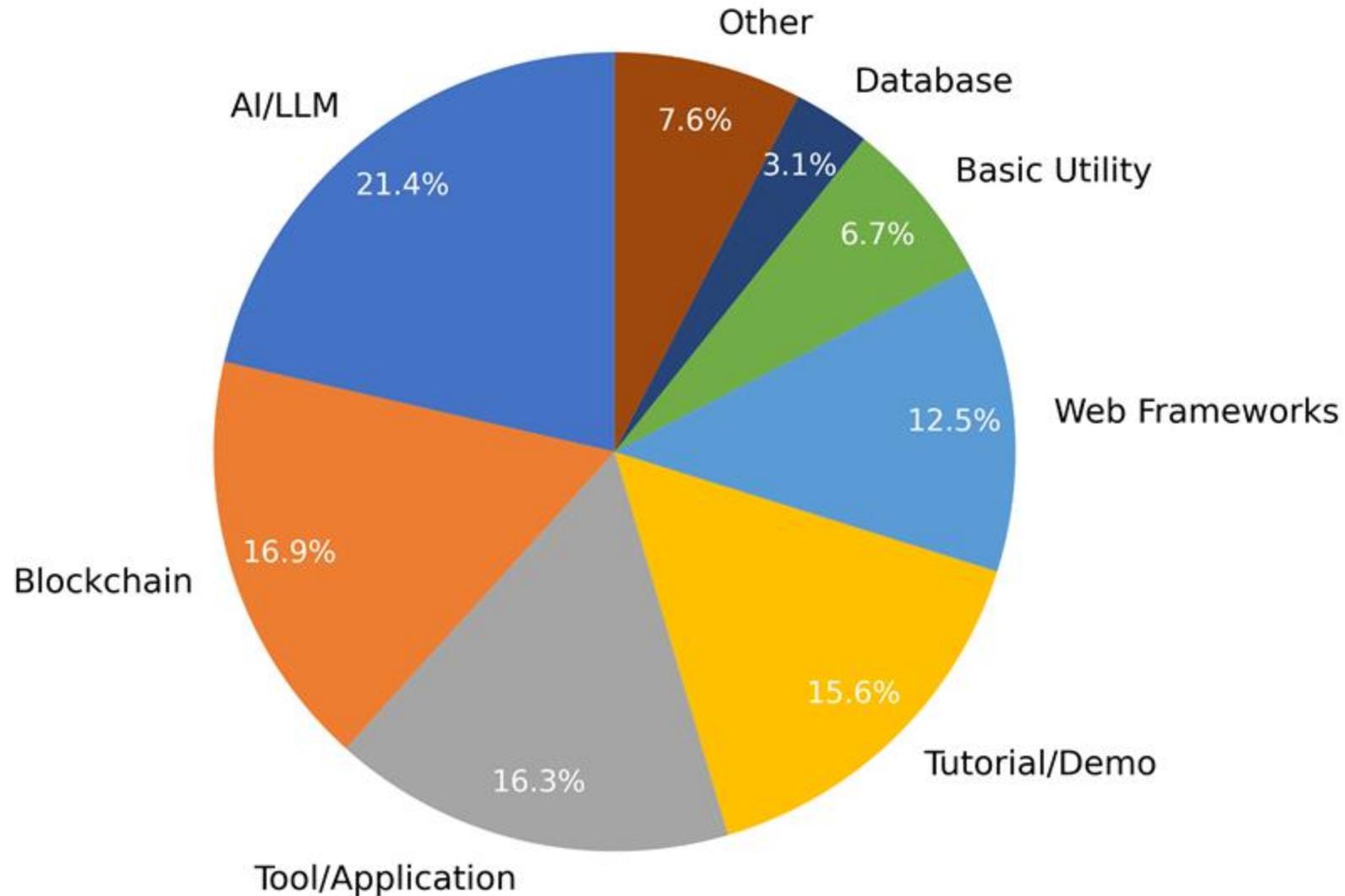


a) Example (game cheats)



b) Example (cryptocurrency)

- **Finding 5:** The remaining (~10%) include **AI**, **crypto**, **app**, **tutorial**, and **web**



- **Finding 6:** Fake stars bring a promotional impact in the short term but **becomes a liability** (leading to less real attention) in the long term

1% real star increase in month t

→ **+0.36% increase** since t + 1

→ **+0.15% increase** since t + 2

→ **+0.10% decrease** since t + 3

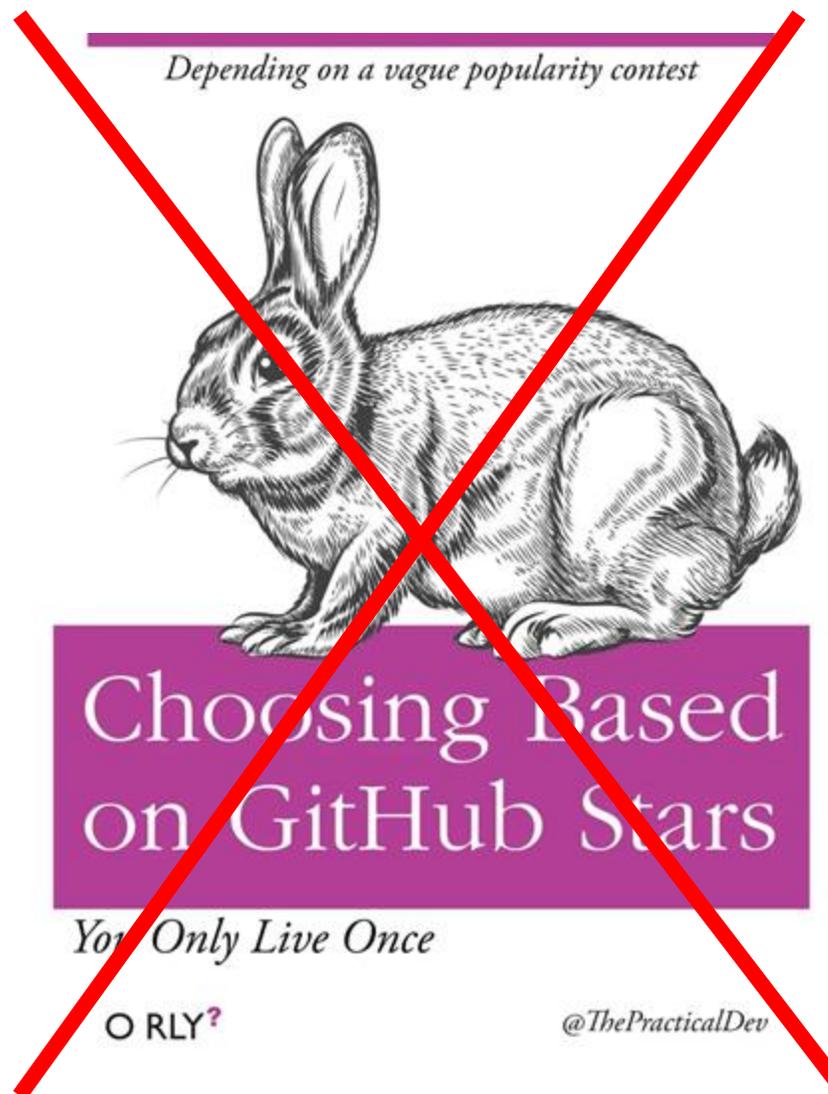
1% fake star increase in month t

→ **+0.07% increase** since t + 1

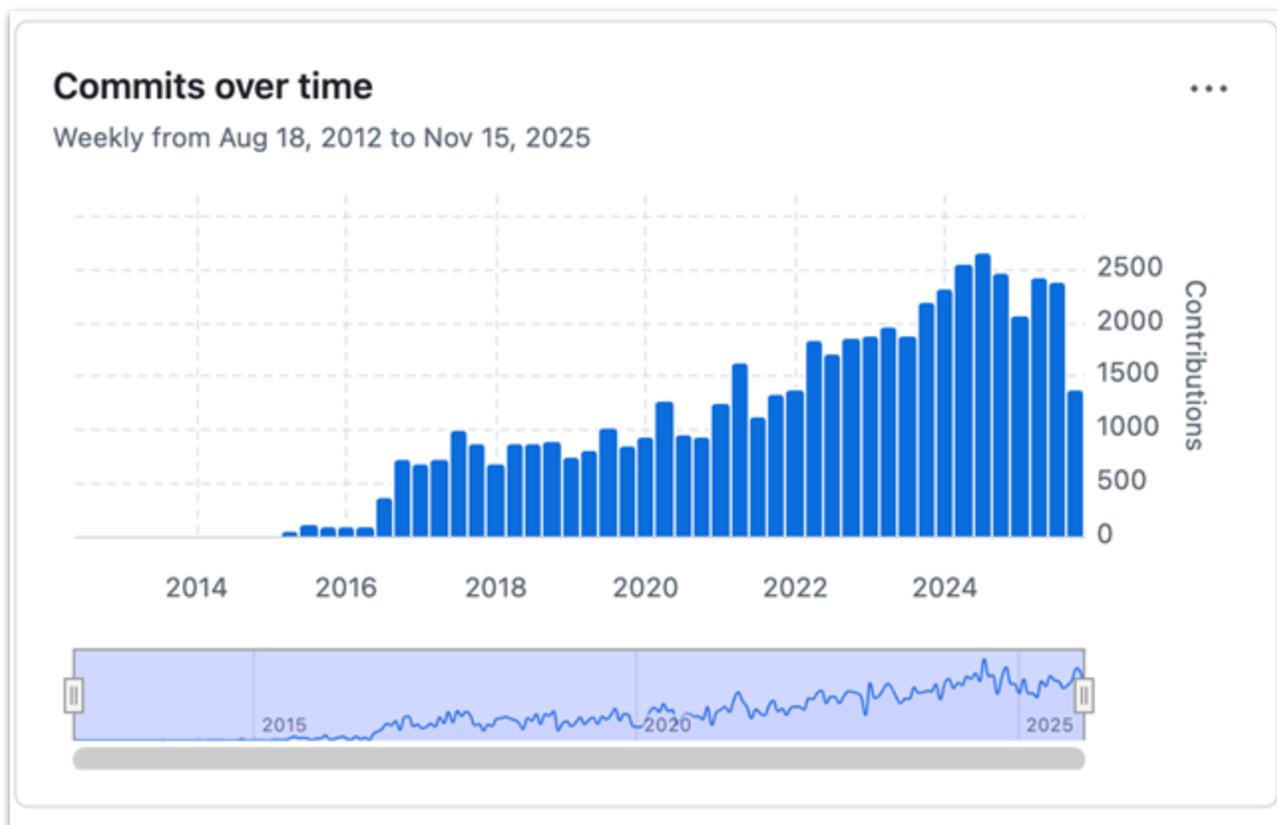
→ **+0.03% increase** since t + 2

→ **-0.04% decrease** since t + 3

Takeaway 1: Star counts should **NOT** be used in high-stake decision scenarios



Takeaway 2: Activity, documentation, and community related signals matters



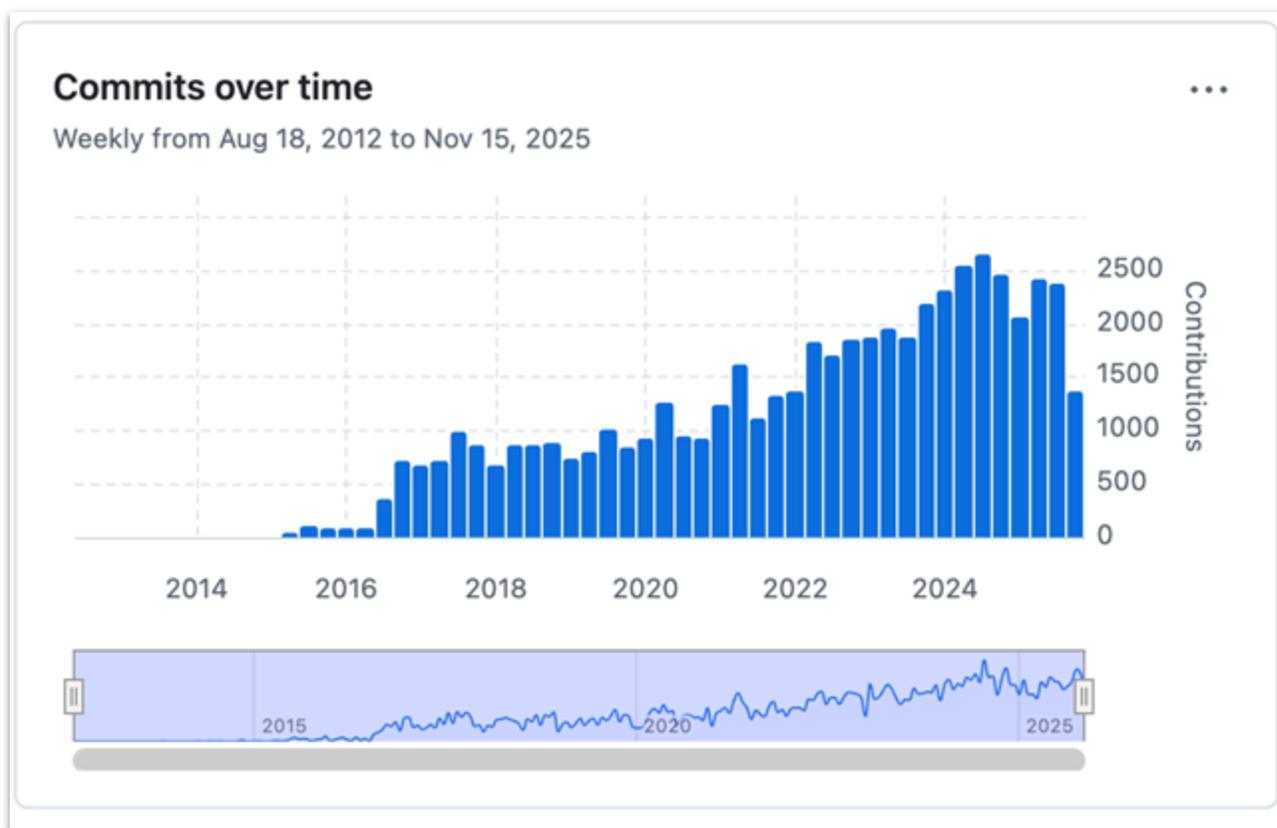

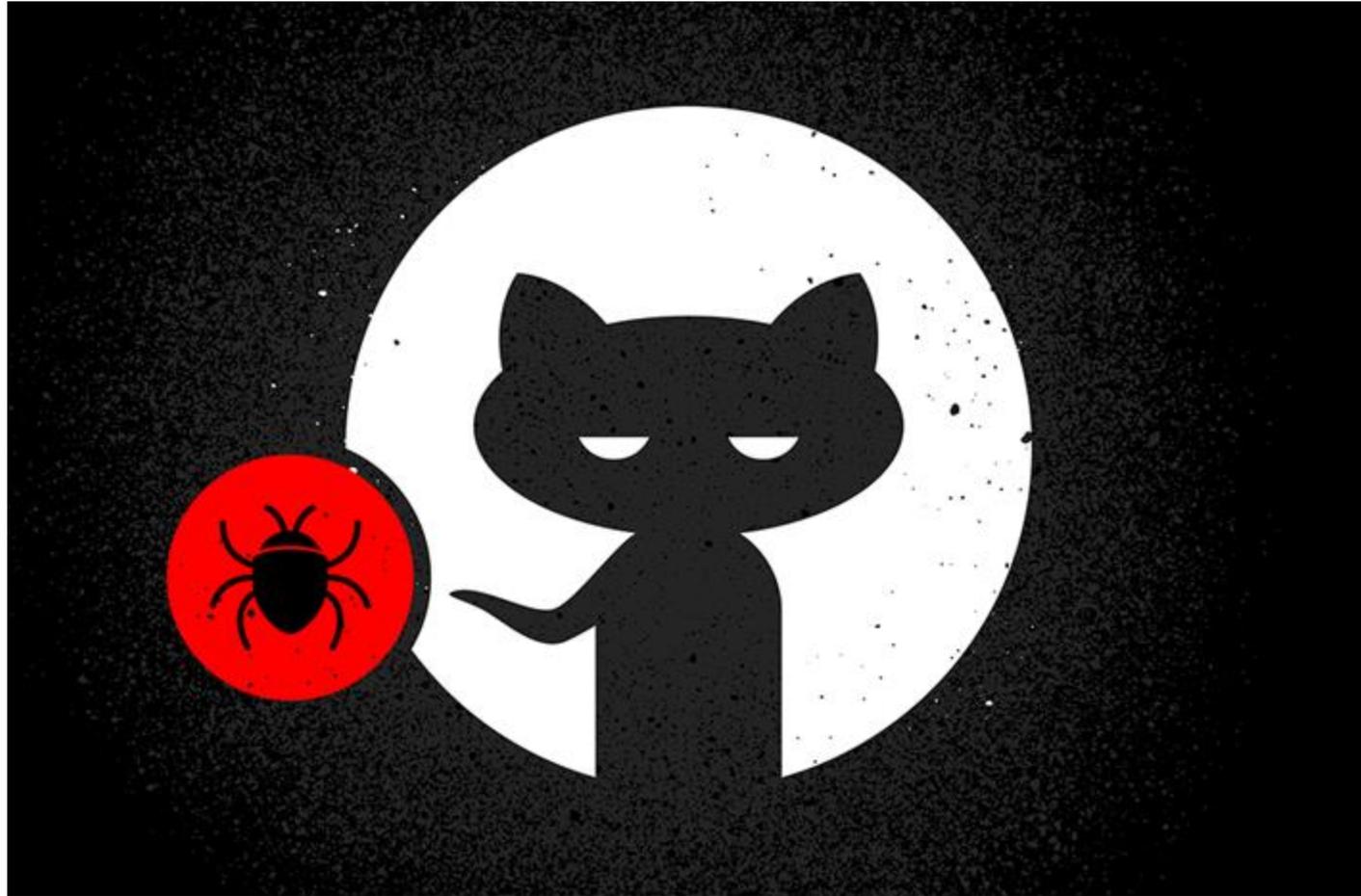
